

#### 2014 Teen Members of the ICB Board of Directors



## **Program Highlights**

#### Intercultural Leadership Skills for Teens Workshops No. 10 & 11

Every year ICB conducts 3-day Intercultural Leadership Skills for Teens workshops at the Vineyard Church of the Rockies, in Fort Collins. Six teens and four adults made up the workshop facilitation team in June. Three of the June participants, Megan Sadar, Ruby Steneroden, and Logan Miller joined the December facilitation team of nine teens and five adults. On the third workshop day, participants make an action plan that focuses on creating a more inclusive, positive environment in their schools and communities. December action plans included:

- Create anti-bully posters to promote Project Unity at their school.
- Educate the school faculty about ICB.
- Systematically end unjustified hate speech.
- Lead by example by showing respect to our teachers.

#### T-Town Middle School Leadership Camp Thompson School District, Loveland, Colorado September 25, 2014



On September 25, 2014, ICB provided a one-day workshop for the Thompson School District EARSS Program. The workshop focused on *Leadership, Culture, and Empowerment* and was held at the Colorado Youth Outdoors facility. ICB Board Members David Brooks and Salomé Cardona and Director Carol Miller worked with the EARSS Project Director Raquel Macias and her staff in leading approximately 75 students from the Thompson School District middle schools on activities that included exploring their cultural similarities and differences, the best/worst leadership traits, and development of their personal commitment pledges to take positive action to make their schools more inclusive and safe for all people.

ICB will be conducting a T-Town High School Leadership Camp workshop for Thompson School District high school students on March 13-14, 2015 at the Colorado State University campus. Ten ICB teen leaders will join with adult facilitators to work with 75 high school students and 10 staff members on the same topic of *Culture, Leadership, and Empowerment.* 



#### Keynote Speaker

ICB Board Member Emma Pattison gave the luncheon keynote address at the Give Next Philanthropy Day on October 5th. Over 150 teen participants from Poudre and Thompson school districts attended to learn about the non-profit philanthropy process. Emma's speech was about her experiences as a member of a non-profit Board of Directors. Carol Miller, Salomé Cardona, and Emma also conducted mini-workshops on the Intercultural Community Builders' Mission and Goals.


